We are seeing entire families living in the woods in conditions you can't even imagine. We are seeing fully employed people who simply can't pay the high cost to rent or afford to purchase a home.

Too many in Hernando County seem to choose to turn their eyes away, maybe roll their eyes, maybe even close their eyes when it comes to the homeless situation in our community.

Not People Helping People. We see it every day. At our door, at our Sunday Blessings meal, at our Tuesday and Friday lunches, at our health clinic, with our free showers, with our Neighborhood Blessings program when we bring food and necessities to homeless campsites in our county.

We also see many folks who *could* do something about it, choosing to not see it.
