PHP Growing Services to Support the Needs of Hernando County

People Helping People hears and sees every day the struggles of our community. People are homeless; people are hungry; people are hurting.

With a mission to alleviate hunger in Hernando County, we know there is much that can be done to prevent people from becoming the hungry, the homeless, the struggling. To that, PHP opens our HELP Center at 1396 Kass Circle to GED classes and AA meetings. We have volunteers to help folks with filling out SNAP application forms, applying for unemployment, finding a job, obtaining an ID.

But there are other needs, other cries for help, or at the minimum, a listening ear. With our commitment to breaking the cycle of poverty, we knew there was more we could do.

This month, we are hosting support groups for what we see as critical needs.

As of March 20th and every other Monday after, PHP is offering to women who are survivors of sexual assault and/or domestic violence a secure environment to meet with others who have experienced similar acts against them. It's a time to spend an hour sharing or quietly listening. The group will be lead by knowledgeable staff and volunteers from the Dawn Center, a certified domestic abuse and sexual violence center, who will provide the tools to heal.

On March 31, we are opening our doors early at 8am to all veterans for an inaugural gathering as an organizational meeting to plan the course of a twice a month coming-together with two different "agendas". Once a month on a weekday, area veterans are encouraged to join other veterans at our HELP Center to support each other and to hear from about programs and services available to them. Additionally, one Saturday a month, veterans are invited to help with hands-on projects for their neighbors in need, to fulfill a veteran's need to continue to give back to the community.





When someone calls our main number 352-686-4466, on most days of the week, their call will be answered by Clyde in a calm and pleasant manner, letting them know they are important to

PHP.

When someone comes to our HELP Center, their first interaction will often be with Clyde, who will greet them with a



reassuring smile to convey that we're here for them.

Who is this compassionate and kind man, and how is PHP lucky enough to have him at our front office?

Clyde has enjoyed a long career in the non profit industry. Since the mid 80s, he's managed a men's shelter, was an outreach worker for homeless men and women, a counselor/then a program manager at a group home, a social worker for a non-profit agency. Once he retired, he volunteered and managed the mental health component of a clinic.

Being on the frontline, he's frustrated by the epidemic of opioid usage, homelessness, and mental health issues in the county. He feels helpless when people call for services beyond what PHP provides and that our referral resources are limited or inadequate. He finds it heartbreaking that some of these people may fall through the cracks in the system.

What keeps him coming back? "The smiles, the appreciation, the thankfulness, and sometimes a hug people exhibit when we provide the services they need. It's such a gratifying feeling. It doesn't get any better than that."
