DO YOU KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOR?

When you think of your neighbor, you probably consider those on either side of your home, across the street, or even a street over from yours.

Your kids may go to school together, play together, are on the same sports teams together.

You may see each other in school carlines, grocery store checkout lines, bank teller lines.

Some neighbors you know really well. You celebrate life's milestones together, enjoy holiday celebrations together, watch each other's children.

But, do you know your neighbor ALICE?

ALICE is an acronym that refers to the people in our community who are Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed.

The United Way of Hernando County just released its latest ALICE report and it can be found in its entirety <u>here</u> on their website. As defined by the report, the ALICE population represents those among us who are working but whose salaries do not match Hernando's general cost of living.

They are educated, hardworking, and striving to create a better life for themselves and their families. They are a **stunning 38%** of Hernando's population. And, an additional 11% of our neighbors are living in poverty. Our neighbors who fall within the ALICE definition are living paycheck to paycheck with no savings to save them

from falling into a financial crisis over a major, unexpected bill. The majority of our neighbors have less than \$400 saved to get through a major event like a catastrophic illness. You know them. They serve you food at restaurants, teach your children, cut and style your hair, stock and ring up your groceries.....

The ALICE population is one large, unplanned payment-due notice away from homelessness.

Every day at PHP, we receive calls from people who cannot pay their rent or mortgage and are at risk of becoming homeless.

The face of the homeless is no longer someone struggling with mental illness or substance abuse.

It's seniors who have lived in their homes for years and are now facing a rent increase they can no longer come close to affording with social security as their only income. They are our neighbor.

Weekend Blessings is supported by grants from the following:







It's a young family with children. One of the parents lost their job making their home no longer affordable. They are our neighbor.

It's a young woman who has fled a violent situation and has nowhere to stay but the streets. She is

our neighbor.

It's a 40 year old man faced with a health crisis and insurmountable medical bills. He is our neighbor.

Fortunately, Hernando County is home to social services organizations with some of the kindest, hard-working people, many of them volunteers. They offer rental assistance and help with utility payments, medical and mental healthcare, clothing, food, assistance with filling out and filing forms, legal advice, job search help, education, shelter.
